Going deeper

Proverbs is a book that teaches the virtues and foundation of wisdom as well as giving much specific advice. Wisdom is not about being clever, but about being able to discern the best course of action in life. It does not give truths that are universally true (e.g. 'murder is wrong'), but rather teaches what is probable (e.g. if you smoke lots, you'll die young). This section includes verses about 'love' and 'trustworthiness'.

Read Proverbs 3:1-10

- 4. Why does the writer say it is important to remember his teaching?
- 5. How does the writer emphasise the importance of 'love' and 'faithfulness'? Why does having these qualities give you a good reputation?
- 6. What reasons does the writer give for trusting God rather than our own ideas? How does this teaching differ from the teaching in our world today?
- 7. Why is it important to honour the Lord with our wealth?
- 8. In what sense are verses 9-10 always true? (cf. Mk. 10:29-30). Why do we need to be careful about how we teach these verses? (cf. 1 Tim. 6:11, 17-19).
