- 6. What important lesson has Paul learnt and who has given him the strength for this? How might learning this lesson help us today?
- 7. What was exceptional about the Philippian church compared with other churches in the early days?
- 8. What does Paul say about their gifts? Who are they an offering to? What does he mean by 'what I desire is that more be credited to your account'? (vs. 17)
- 9. How are the Philippian Christians a positive example for us today?

 - f. How did Paul and his companions think they were meant to help the Macedonians?
- 3. Read Acts 16:11-15
 - a. Paul normally starts by preaching at a Synagogue (cf. 14:1; 17:2,10). Why might they have been disappointed by the place of prayer they found in Philippi?
 - b. How do we know Lydia was rich?
 - c. In what way did Lydia need help?
 - d. Who is responsible for Lydia becoming a believer?
 - e. How does Lydia offer support for further mission in Philippi? (cf. 16:40)
